Be a Part of Faith Formation

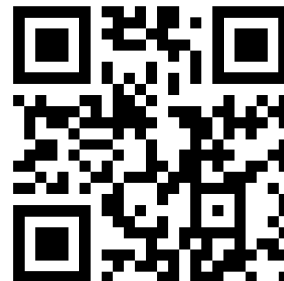
