let us give thanks for the gifts of baptism.

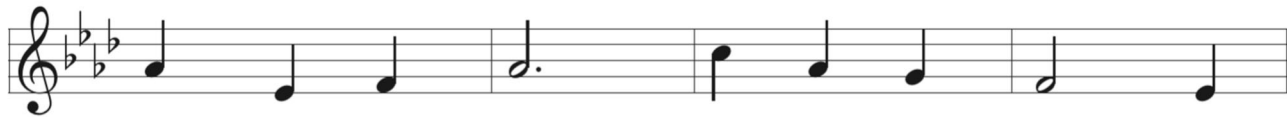
We give you thanks, Holy One, for washing us and drawing us into your community.

Thanks be to God. Amen.

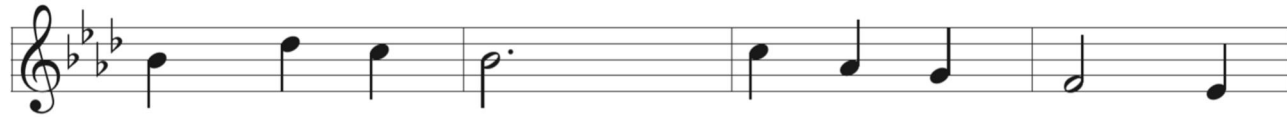
